Blessed Anne of St. Bartholomew, pray for us!

Ecclesiastes 3:1-2, 8

For everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted. A time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.



June 1: St. Justin Martyr (100-165). Oh yes. The man. He was a Greek from Samaria (Shechem) who travelled as a visiting philosopher from Ephesus to Alexandria. In Ephesus, an old, respectable, meek man spoke to him about the Christ and “my spirit was immediately set on fire, and affection for the friends of Christ took hold of me.” He was executed in Rome by Marcus Aurelius with 6 others. Again, I love authentic witnesses who on their tabula rasa wrote the account of his martyrdom.

June 2: The Martyrs of Lyons (177+). Oh yes. Again, authentic eyewitnesses record the ghastly execution of these martyrs: Sanctus, Blandina, Maturus, Attalus. The dungeon and amphitheater where they suffered and died can still be visited in Lyons, France.

June 3: St. Charles Lwanga and companions (1886+)

Saints Alive!

were pages at the court of King Mwanga who refused to give the king the sexual favors he demanded. Charles became the head catechist and baptized the younger of the pages at night before the 22 Catholics and 24 Protestants were marched 16 miles to the place of execution on Lake Victoria in Uganda.

June 4: St. Quirinus (308), the bishop in what is now Sisak, Croatia was seized for the crime of being a Christian, was marched to what is now Hungary and was martyred there. His true relics were brought to Rome in the early fifth century and are now venerated at Santa Maria in Trastevere. St. Jerome (from Dalmatia) proudly speaks of this fellow countryman.

June 5: St. Boniface (675-754) is called the apostle of Germany. He was from England and left with a missionary monastic band to evangelize central Germany. I hope to see his relics in Fulda, along with his bloodied breviary still bearing the hatchet marks of his martyrdom.

June 6: St. Norbert (1080-1134) was a blasé nobleman till he was knocked off his horse in a violent thunderstorm. The conversion was sudden and complete. He sold everything and went to Rome to confess his misdeeds to the pope himself. He founded the Premonstratensians and his relics were preserved from Lutheran Magdeburg by moving them to Catholic Strabov.

June 7: Blessed Anne of St. Bartholomew (1626) St. Teresa of Avila repeatedly talks about her special companion as a great servant of God. Teresa died in Anne’s arms. After Teresa’s death Anne helped open convents from Paris to Antwerp. When she died, this sister had 20,000 show up for her funeral: not bad for a cloistered discolored Carmelite nun!

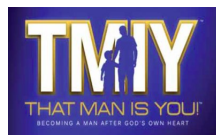
St. John's Summer Program 2026
