

St. Vincent Strambi

September 25: St. Vincent **Strambi** (1745-1824)

became a Passionist priest and bishop, known for his insistence on all priests singing Gregorian chant. The result: a genuine liturgicallybased fervor in his diocese.

September 26: SS Cosmas and Damian (287+) are the twin brothers and physician martyrs who died just north of Antioch in Syria. The rite of incubation for healing dreams started with them in Constantinople.

St. Thérèse Couderc (1805-1885) is the founder of the "Daughters of St. Regis;" she Manila for Japan – and who dedicated her life to giving retreats to the women who arrived in pilgrimage at the shrine of St. John Francis Regis in LaLouvesc. Her incorrupt body is just up the street from the relics of our

patron saint. Blessed and soon to be canonized

September 27: St. Vincent de Paul (1581-1660) spent two years as a slave in Tunisia, which gave him a tender concern for the poorest ones. He personally contributed to the complete renewal of the clergy in 17th century France. Visit his relics just around the block from the Rue du Bac in Paris.

September 28: St. Lorenzo Ruiz (1637+) is the glorious Filipino martyr who left remained constant during arrest, the slow burning of his body and then the torture of the pit.

September 29: SS Archangels Michael, Gabriel, Raphael are the archangels sent to protect, communicate and heal all who call. Popular devotion to Michael grows by leaps and bounds in this time of crisis.

September 30: St. Jerome $\overline{(345-420)}$ takes the award as the most learned, difficult, restless and combative of saints ever! He is best known for his scholarship in Bethlehem from age 40 to 75. I prayed at his cell in Bethlehem and at his relic's shrine at Santa Maria

October 1: St. St. Thérèse de Lisieux (1873-1897). Sigh. "I am perfectly sure that I shall not stay inactive in heaven; my desire is to go on working for the Church and for souls."
