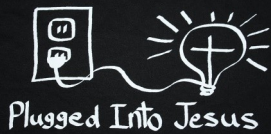
SACRAMENTS

MARRIAGES—Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the ceremony.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Please notify the rectory when a parishioner would like to receive the sacraments and is homebound, in a nursing home, or in the hospital.

R.C.I.A.—(Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): Those who are interested in becoming Catholic or completing their sacraments are invited to contact the rectory at any time.

Saints Alive! Fr. Ray's favorite Saints this week...

May 13th: St Andre Fournet (1752-1834) gives hope to all parents whose precious children say, "religion is boring". Andre was idle and frivolous and ran away from home to pursue a life of pleasure. And he had bad handwriting! He was ordained in 1776 with the encouragement of a devout diocesan priest and uncle. He weathered the French revolution and became a spiritual director for St Elizabeth Bichier des Ages.

May 14: St Matthias (first century) followed Jesus from baptism to the ascension, and was selected by lot to take the place of Judas Iscariot. St Clement of Alexandria seems to have an oral legend that recounts that St Matthias stressed the mortification of the flesh. I took him as a special patron when I was ordained to the diaconate on this day 38 years ago.

May 16: St Simon Stock (1265) is the early English Carmelite who fled Mt Carmel during Saracen persecution, and set up Carmelite foundations through western Europe. He is revered for the tradition of the brown scapular and it's Marian apparition and promise.

May 17: St Paschal Baylon (1540-1592) is the peasant Franciscan Spanish brother who started the tradition of the Eucharistic congress. He is known for levitating in rapt adoration before the blessed sacrament.

Community Service Opportunity

The St. John's Charitable Society (SJCS) is a group of parish volunteers whose goal is to assist residents of St. Mary's County who are struggling to make ends meet.

The primary work of SJCS is carried out through a phone ministry whereby our volunteers accept calls from those in need, and determine if, and how, SJCS can help. Working in teams of two, our volunteers commit to taking calls over a two week period. Phone assignments occur approximately 4-5 times per year, and are planned around each volunteer's schedule requirements.

All calls are handled on a dedicated SJCS cell phone and all client information is kept confidential. A meeting of SJCS members takes place every other Thursday evening to review and discuss client calls. Otherwise, the phone ministry is carried out within the volunteer's home environment. Training is provided for new volunteers.

In addition to the phone ministry, SJCS volunteers also engage in:

Organizing the Christmas Angel Tree Program, to help make Christmas happier for a child or elderly person in need.

Coordinating St. John's parish participation in Wrapping Arms 'Round Many (WARM). The St. John's volunteers participate as a "helping church" in the local interfaith effort to provide meals and overnight shelter for overflow homeless of St. Mary's County during the winter.

Through participation in SJCS, our volunteers: Improve lives; Provide second chances; Meet others who desire to put Christian values into action by serving the local community.

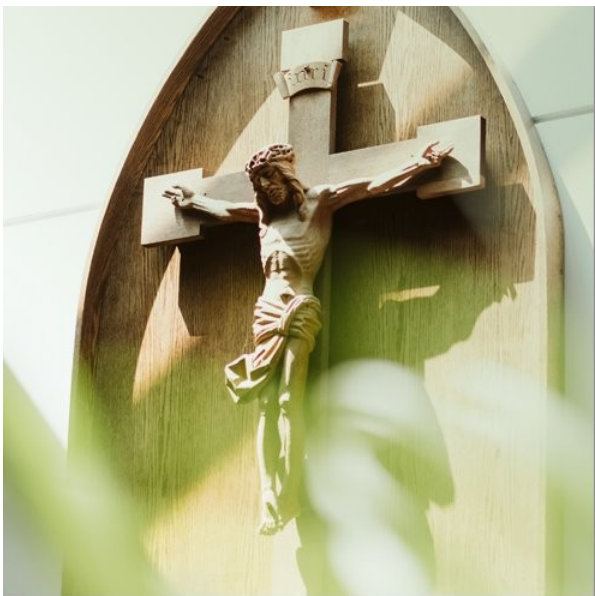

How to make a Spiritual Communion

There is no formula but some recommendations are:

- Start with the sign of the Cross
- Read and reflect on the readings for Mass for the day

- Have a real desire to be united to Christ
- Acknowledge your sins and ask for forgiveness
- Receive Christ in your soul and pray an Act of Spiritual Communion
- Offer thanksgiving

What is Spiritual Communion?

Spiritual Communion is a way to be spiritually united to Christ when we are unable to physically receive the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist.

St. Thomas Aquinas defined it as “an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him.”

St. Alphonsus Liguori’s *Act of Spiritual Communion*

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament.

I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul.

Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.

I embrace You as if You were already there, and unite myself wholly to You.

Never permit me to be separated from You.
Amen.
