<u>December 18: St. Rufus and</u> <u>St. Zosimus</u> (107) thrown to the lions in Rome – they get a shout out from St. Ignatius of Antioch and St. Polycarp!!

December 19: Bd. Urban V (1310-1370). A French priest from Languedoc and trained in Toulouse, Paris and Avignon who became pope. He listened to Petrarch and St. Bridget of Sweden, who encouraged him to move to Rome. He is the sainted pope of sorrow, suffering and deep emotion as he wept over the state of the Church in Avignon and Rome.

<u>December 20: St. Ammon</u> <u>and companions</u> (250).

Shout out to Deacon Ammon Ripple on his patronal nameday! He was a brave soldier who declared himself a Christian and was martyred with those he was sent to guard in Alexandria Egypt.

Saints Alive!

St. Domingo de Silos (1073). This St. Domingo appeared to Bd. Joan of Aza in a vision at the end of her pilgrimage – and told her that she will have a son, henceforth to be named the other St. Dominic, who would change the world.

December 21 St. Peter Canisius (1521-1597). The 'second apostle to Germany' and the Catholic revival (Counter Reformation) largely come from this Jesuit's work. All it took was one Ignatian retreat and he was in. He moved finally to Fribourg in Switzerland and keeps the city Catholic to this day.

Dec 23: St. Margaret d'Youville (1701-1771) an unhappily married frontier woman (her husband was a fur trader who illegally sold booze to the Native Americans). She seems caught on fire for the faith when her husband died. She became a religious sister of a new congregation: "les soeurs grises".

the great cedars, this poor
shepherd became a
mystical Maronite monk
and sang Mass in the
Aramaic language of Jesus.
