

Saint Ambrose, Pray for us! December 1: St. Eloi (588-660). Bishop of Tournai with a remarkable talent for metalwork as a goldsmith extraordinaire. Several of his works are still in museums. Special love for ransoming slaves and preaching against the work of fortunetellers and practitioners of the occult.

December 2: Bd. Jan van Ruysbroeck (1293-1381). Rhineland mystic whose books in the Brabant-Flemish dialect are extraordinary. He would spend hours in the forest where no human distraction came between his ear and the voice of God.

December 3: St. Francis Xavier (1506-1552). Venerate his relic at St. Mary's Ryken - come to think of it, I might swipe it for the 7:00am Mass here at St. John's and have it returned before classes begin at SMR. I like to imagine him

at the age of 46 on the deserted island of Shang-chuan, 100 miles southwest of Hong Kong, dying alone with such zeal in his heart.

December 4: St. John Damascene (657-749) left his home in Damascus and became a monk of such brilliance - he took 5 centuries of Christian literature in Mar Saba and synthesized it into a remarkable work of theological depth.

Bd Adolf Kolping (1813-1865) would have been known by my greatgrandfather in the factories of the Ruhrgebiet in Germany, as thousands of impoverished Catholics fled the failing farms for the promise and hope of industrial life; Adolf ministered to them all.

December 5: St. Nick Stenson (1638-1686) went from Danish Lutheran doctor of anatomy to Catholic bishop of Munster. His relic shrine is at the Basilica of San Lorenzo in Florence/What a conversion story!

December 6: St. Nicholas

(270-343). I invite you to visit the Christian ruins of Myra in Turkey or the shrine relic in Bari in Italy to get a sense of the real St. Nick.

Bd Peter Pascual (1227-1300) was a bishop imprisoned in Granada for having preached to the Muslims. He was the 6th of his family to be recognized by the Church as canonized martyrs.

December 7: St. Ambrose (340-397) the man, the legend! Imagine bringing St Augustine to the baptismal font - and you get the radiant grace of this bishop. I have fervently prayed at his relic's shrine four times already.


