Saints Peter and Paul

Ecclesiastes 3:1-2, 8

For everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted. A time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.



June 26: SS. John and Paul (362+) were brother martyrs whose relics were deposited on the Coelian Hill in Rome since the 4th century. Some of the frescoes at this church date back to the 2nd century! We recite their names in the first canon of the Mass.

St José María Escrivá (1902-1975) had a divine vision in 1928 concerning the founding of "Opus Dei", or "the Work." This (primarily) lay movement was finally approved in 1983 as a personal prelature of the Holy See. I hope to pray at his tomb at the Villa Tevere in Rome this December.

June 27: St. Cyril of Alexandria (376-444). Cyril championed the title of Mary as Theotokos, "Mother of God" or "God-bearer" in order to highlight the reality of the Incarnation. As Patriarch of Alexandria, he drove out all who disagreed with him spiritually: orthodoxy at all costs started in 412.

Saints Alive!

June 28: St. Irenaeus de Lyons (125-202) grew up in Smyrna, was greatly influenced by St. Polycarp, then moved to Lyons in Gaul, with many other Greek merchants, and became bishop of this thriving community. He fought Gnosticism in all forms and called for their "stripping of the fox".

June 29: SS Peter and Paul (64+). Earliest representations show Peter as sturdy and thickset, with a curly beard, and Paul as thin and bald, with a long head, scanty beard and deep-set eyes. Could it be a living memory?

June 30: Martyrs of Rome under Nero (64-68+) only since 1969 has this feast been moved to the day after SS Peter and Paul – as we remember July 19th of 64, and the fires that broke out in Rome. The fire raged for 7 days and nights: 2/3rds of Rome was destroyed. Christians were martyred and singled-out as the

scapegoats in Nero's palace gardens for the amusement of the nightly crowds. Nero committed suicide four years later.

July 1: St. Oliver Plunkett (1625-1681). County Meath native and elevated to the position of the Archbishop of Armagh and was falsely accused of treason. See his head on display in Drogheda and **St. Junípero Serra** (1713-1784) Spanish Franciscan who founded 22 missions from Baja to Central coastal California. Pray at his relic's shrine in Carmel-by-the-Sea.

July 2: St. Otto of Bamberg (1062-1139) is the bishop hailed as the 'apostle of Pomerania'. He evangelized this part of Poland with great effectiveness. And **Bd. Peter of Luxembourg** (1369 - 1387) is patron of Avignon – though he spent only the last year of his life advising the pope at the court. My 'home' parish – St. Didier – is the place where his relic's shrine is located.





