October 3: St. Ewald (695+) *der schwarze und der weiße* were brother British missionaries martyred in Dortmund; their bodies are enshrined as St. Cunibert's church in Köln. (My great-grandfather Schmidt was named for them.) I hope to pray there someday.

October 4: St. Francis of Assisi (1182-1226). I'm rereading the *fioretti*—written just years after his death; so much emphasis on Francis' radical poverty despite illnesses of eyes, liver, spleen and stomach. He is my confirmation saint and I've prayed at his tomb in Assisi 5 times already.

October 5: St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938) Her vision of light streaming from the side of Christ now enhance the Sacred Heart devotion.

Bd. Raymond of Capua (1330-1399) was St. Catherine of Siena's biographer and spiritual director. He had the privilege of carrying her head from Rome to Siena.

Saints Alive!

Bd. Bartolo Longo (1841-1926) I've prayed at his tomb twice in Pompeii. He is a great friend during exorcisms— for he himself was once formerly a Satanic high priest.

October 6: St. Foy de Conques (3rd Century) Read *Little Saint* by Hannah Green. You'll fall in love with her too! I have an entire posse of 12 year old female martyrs whose company I cherish. She is one of them.

October 7: St. Justina of Padua was an early virgin martyr of great renown: many attributed the victory of the battle of Lepanto to her intercession since the naval battle won the day. Her Basilica is glorious in its tranquility, and houses the remains of St. Luke as well.

St. Mark, Pope (336+) was Pope for 8 months but he wrote the first list of both popes and martyrs of Rome. I don't know why, I just like him. Pray at his

relics tomb at the church he founded – San Marco's - in bustling Piazza Venezia, Roma.

October 8: St. Demetrius, the Great Martyr is a fifth century deacon from Sirmium (Mitrovic in Serbia) who became a patron of the crusaders who fashioned him into a warrior saint along with St. George. Shout out to Demetrius Clyburn!

October 9: St John Leonardi (1542-1609) is our pharmacist turned priest helped by St. Philip Neri and St. José de Calasanz to grow the missionary college in Rome: Propaganda Fide.

St. Denis de Paris (258+) is the first bishop martyr of Paris; his relics survived the French Revolution intact and are on display at the Basilica St. Denis.

St. Luis Bertrán (1526-1581) dark and brooding Dominican who nonetheless was friend to St. Teresa of Avila and even evangelized the US Virgin Islands before returning to Valencia.


