St. Carlo Borromeo Pray for us!

November 6: St. Leonard de

Noblac (sixth century). Shout out to the mysterious saint who gives his name to St. Leonard's Creek and Leonardtown. Patron Saint of POWs.

Bd. Jeanne de Maillé (1332-1414) Patron saint of those who visit POW's. Go figure. Died at the age of 82.

November 7: Bd. Anthony **Baldinucci** (1665-1717) is my favorite Jesuit saint who preached with such dramatic force that pornography, cards and dice would be heaped up into bonfires of the vanities. He died of exhaustion at the age of 52.

November 8: Bd. John Duns Scotus (1265-1308) is the Scottish Franciscan who gave us the theological framework for the Immaculate Conception; he died at the age of 43 in Köln where his relics are venerated to this day in the Cathedral.

Saints Alive!

Quatuor Coronati (306+). Four martyred stonemasons – from what is now Mitrovica - whose relics were brought to Rome for the great Basilica on cloak on a freezing winter the Coelian Hill.

Bd. Elizabeth of the Trinity (1880-1906) is the brilliant French Carmelite from Dijon whose mystical writings on the Trinity are astonishing. She offered her sufferings with Addison's Disease and perished at the age of 26.

November 10: St. Leo the Great (461+) line to venerate his body at highlight of his career: the tome of Leo sent to the council of Chalcedon-- that was so brilliant that the theologians cried out, "Peter has spoken through the mouth to create the Uniate Church of Peter!"

St. Andrew Avellino (1512-1608). Neapolitan Theatine Counter-Reformation priest and friend of St. Carlo Borromeo. Shout out to Fr. Avellino González.

Nov. 11: St. Martin de Tours (336-397) 'the glory of ancient Gaul and a light to the Western Church in the 4th century" had a great biographer in the person of

Sulpicius Severus. Born in Hungary, educated in Pavia, conscripted soldier in Amiens, famous exorcist. and then a glorious bishop in Poitiers; he is the one made famous for cutting his army day and clothing a halfnaked beggar who was indeed 'Christ in disguise'. He is the patron saint of military chaplains.

Nov 12: St. Josaphat (1580 -1623). I always make a bee St. Peter's in Rome. Born in Western Ukraine, he fought (Orthodox liturgy with allegiance to Rome).
