**St. Julius the Veteran,
Pray for us!**

May 25th: St. Gregory VII Hildebrand (1021-1085) Pray at his tomb in Salerno and read about his boldness in dealing with secular power. A champion of Church liberty and priestly holiness.

May 26th: St. Philip Neri (1515-1595) One of the most attractive saints of all time because of his joy and sense of humor. He had a mystical experience in the Roman catacombs of a ball of fire enter his mouth—he felt his breast expand. The autopsy decades later show broken sternum and a swelling over his heart the size of a man’s fist. I was ordained on this day in 1984 and Cardinal Hickey spoke about St. Philip in my ordination homily.

May 27: St. Julius the Veteran (304+). What a

great saint for the week of Memorial Day! His story – written from the viewpoint of a devout soldier – describes his service of 27 years with an excellent military record. He refused to sacrifice to the Roman gods and was executed at Silistria, Bulgaria.

May 28: Bd. Margaret Pole (1473-1541). Henry VIII (who called her the saintliest woman in England) gave her in marriage to Sir Reginald Pole. She expressed her disapproval of Henry’s marriage to Ann Boleyn. She was poorly executed by a novice in the square in London this day.

May 29: Bd. Ursula Ledochowska (1865-1939) is an Ursuline nun in Cracow who evangelized Russia and Scandinavia between the Wars and founded a religious order for this purpose.

May 30: St. Joan of Arc (1412-1431). I love her openness to mysticism and even more so her mother’s courage in appealing to the Holy See twenty years after her daughter’s death. Successfully, Joan was exonerated then beatified and canonized by 1920. **St. Ferdinand of Castile** (1199-1252) was a king who battled for 27 years to free one-third of Spain from the Moors. I asked his prayers in the cathedral of Burgos which he restored.

May 31: Visitation! Mary and Elizabeth are so keenly aware of the Savior and prophet that grow in their respective wombs; meditate on the embrace and the spirit-led prophecy between these two glorious women.

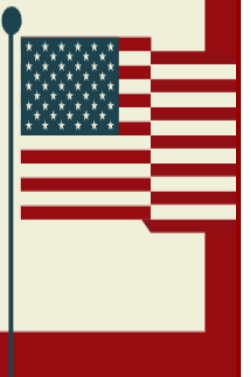

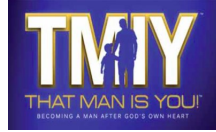
