**St. Gregory
Barbarigo
Pray for us!**

June 18: St. Gregory Barbarigo (1625-1697). Talk about life styles of the rich and famous! This wealthy Venetian gave it all away: 800,000 crowns. On some level, he is the archetype of the saintly philanthropist.

June 19: St. Romuald (950-1027). I remember him at San Apollinare-in-Class where he fled after watching his father kill a relative in a duel. Romuald founded the Camaldolese hermits. Fr. Flum spent years with this religious order before returning to the diocese.

SS Gervasio e Protasio (second century) is buried on either side of Saint Ambrose. Check out their beautifully dressed bones in San Ambrogio, Milano.

St Juliana Falconieri (1270-1341) when in Florence, remember to pray at her relic shrine at the Annunciation church. She founded the Servite nuns. She was so holy, her

mother asked her daughter to become her spiritual director!

June 20: St. Alban (209+). Protomartyr of England who was executed for being a Christian 25 miles north of London.

Bd. Osanna of Mantua (1449-1505) was betrothed to Christ at the age of 18 in a mystic vision. She had repeated visions of Christ as a crucified child as she relived the tortures of Calvary in her own flesh. She prayed for the salvation of Pope Alexander VI (a Borgia). God responded with a countenance of wrath.

June 21: St. Aloysius Gonzaga (1568-1591) had St. Robert Bellarmine as his spiritual director. He had a horrendous battle with his family to get permission to become a Jesuit. He died a victim of the plague as a 23 year old seminarian.

June 22: St. John Fisher and Thomas More (1535+). Fisher kept a skull on his table during mealtimes to remind him of death; when the Pope sent him the cardinal's hat, the enraged Henry VIII

swore that he will not have a head to set it on. Thomas More married Jane Colt and then later as a widower, Alice Middleton. His house was the center of hospitality, learning and prayer for his four children and all who would visit. June

June 23: St. Joseph Cafasso (1811-1860) was the spiritual director and friend of Saint John Bosco and was a small man, with a twisted spine, but who had a beautiful sonorous voice and a serenity called, "an undisturbed tranquility".

Please notify the rectory when a parishioner would like to receive the sacraments and is homebound, in a nursing home, or in the hospital.

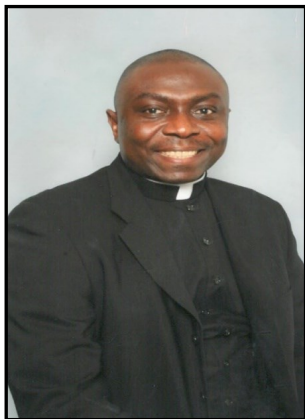
R.C.I.A

CORPUS CHRISTI

Feast of Corpus Christi, also called Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, **festival of the Roman Catholic Church in honor of the real presence of the body (corpus) of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.**

The Corpus Christi procession is **a centuries-old tradition of the Catholic faith to process the Real Presence of Jesus, the Eucharist, in public.** The feast of Corpus Christi was established in Liege, Belgium, in 1247.

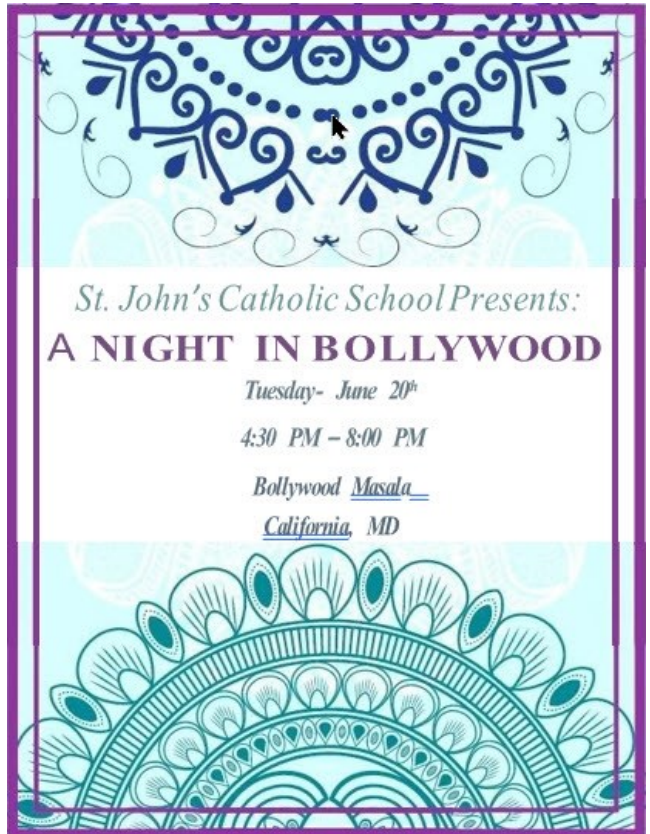
