

St. Geneviève de Paris Pray for us!

Dec 31: Pope St. Silvestro I (335). I hope to be praying at his relics again this year on the very day he is commemorated worldwide. He is renowned as a pope who was so close to a corrupt government but kept his hands free from all graft and corruption. Always remember our favorite pals: JOHN FRANCIS REGIS (1640) AND CATHERINE LABOURÊ (1876) who both died on New Year's Eve -just before Midnight! Jan 1: St. Joseph Tomasi (1649-1713). Theatine Scholar of Greek philosophy, Hebrew language, and Catholic liturgical music! Jan 2: St. Basil and St. Gregory were best buds, born the same year (329) and in the same town in Cappadocia. They were college roommates in Athens and both became brilliant scholarly bishops. Good guys both!

### Saints Alive!

Jan 3: St. Geneviève de Paris (422-500). This patron saint of Paris stood up to Attila the Hun. The Panthéon was built as her relic shrine, but her relics were destroyed in the French Revolution. Jan 4: St Elizabeth Ann Seaton (1774-1821) is even celebrated by the Italians today because she was moved to convert to Catholicism because of the piety and intellectual charity of her friends in Livorno. But remember, Bd. Angela da Foligno (1248-1309) today as well! I love women mystics.

Jan 5: St. John Neumann (1811-1860). He is the first saint I ever venerated in Doylestown PA, while visiting my aunt and uncle. I knelt at the altar rail, fought back tears, kissed the relic, took a holy card and started fantasizing about priesthood from that day. (I was a sophomore in High School.) But read about Bd. John Andrew Houben (1821-1893) as well – a Dutch missionary to Dublin Ireland. God bless both countries

January 6: St. Andrew Corsini (1302-1373) was a dissipated and vicious

young Florentine noble who was converted by the reproaches of his tough-asnails mom. This Avignontrained Carmelite was a specialist in reconciling warring factions. His relic shrine is in Florence to this day. St Charles of Sezze (1613-1670) a humble Franciscan friar with breathtaking insight as a spiritual director. I hope to pray at his tomb in Trastevere. St. André Bessette (1845-1937) it's hard to believe that our hardy group of pilgrims was praying at his tomb this time last year. He spent 3 years in Rhode Island, but returned to Canada to become a Holy Cross Brother. He spread a devotion to St. Joseph wherever he went and was known for the miraculous healings that followed in his wake.






