Saints Alive!

Feb 26: St Porphyry of Gaza (353-421) was a zealous bishop in Gaza City who destroyed paganism and brought the wholesale conversion of the region to Christianity.

Feb 27: St Anne Line (1565-1601) was raised as a fervent Calvinist. Anne converts to Catholicism at the age of 20. For the crime of hiding priests, she is hanged at Tyburn. St. Gabriel Possenti (1838-1862) was "a lady's man" who becomes a Passionist and dies at the age of 24. He is the patron saint of the NRA – because of his marksmanship in defending women from ruffians with his trusty pistol. We visited his shrine in Italy in 2024.

Feb 28: Bd Daniel Brottier (1876-1936). French missionary of the Holy Spirit who built the cathedral in Senegal...he becomes a chaplain during WW I and spends 52 months on the front lines. His later years? Orphanages in Auteuil. He gave St. Thérèse all the credit for his extraordinary life.

Mar 1: St. Swithbert (713). An extraordinary English missionary to German tribes in Friesland; visit his shrine in St. Peter's Kaiserswerth.

Mar 2: Bd. Charles le
Bon (1081-1127). Danish
nobleman reared in
Flanders from the age of 5
– and martyred for the sake
of the poor -- as he prayed
in the same church of St.
Donatian in Bruges where
his shrine still exist.

Mar 3: St. Katharine
Drexel (1858-1955).

"Kate" was a multimillionaire heiress – who gave it all away to work with the native and African American missions. St.

Cunegunda (1039).

Devout empress of the Holy Roman Empire and buried with her saintly husband (Heinrich) at the cathedral of Bamberg.
