

Jan 26: St. Timothy and Titus (first century). Read about Timothy in Acts 16, 18:5, 19:22, 29:4. Read about Titus in 2 Corinthians 8:6, 16-17, 23. They are "partners and co-workers (with St. Paul) Geneva) oversees conversions in your service" Even now!

Jan 27: St. Angela Merici (1470-1540) grew up on the banks of Lake Como who took a pilgrimage to the Holy Land – lost her eyesight in Crete but finished the pilgrimage blind.
