Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to an exciting year for you as you help prepare your children for the Sacrament of Confirmation. We look forward to working with you as your child begins this wonderful journey to unite her/him more firmly with Christ.

Enclosed in this packet are many forms to be completed and returned to your child's catechist in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. We ask that you return all of the forms, competed, at one time to your child's catechist not later than December 10, 2023. Incomplete packets will not be accepted. Do NOT submit packets to the rectory.

As in past years, our Confirmation retreat will be an overnight retreat at the Loyola Retreat House (http://www.loyolaonthepotomac.com) in Faulkner, MD. The dates for the retreat will be announced as soon as we have them, with the girls attending after school Monday-Tuesday and the boys attending after school Tuesday-Wednesday. There will be bus transportation to/from St. John's. The enclosed parental consent form, must be completed and **returned to your child's catechist** by December 8, 2022. Public school children will be excused on the day of their retreat with a legal absence, but SMCPS now requires parents to request the excused absence. Please remember that this is a **mandatory** event for all Confirmation candidates. If it is absolutely not possible for your child to attend the retreat, please research other retreat options and call Rich Olon to discuss ideas for a substitute retreat for your child. For those parents who have been fingerprinted as a volunteer under the ADW's child protection policy and attended the VIRTUS Protecting God's Children workshop, if you would like to chaperone, please let me know as soon as possible.

Proper attire for Confirmation Mass:

Ladies should wear a dress or dressy pantsuit. Please dress conservatively: cover your shoulders (no spaghetti straps) and wear a skirt or dress of appropriate length (at least knee-length). Gentlemen should wear a sport jacket or suit jacket, dress slacks, dress shirt, and tie. Dress shoes, please: no tennis shoes.





REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

Responsibility of Parent

The decree of the sacrament of Confirmation demands personal initiative by the candidate. It is most important that the parents know and understand this in order to encourage their children in a supportive way. No teachers, school, or textbooks can match the formative influence parents have on their own child, especially in the area of religious belief; therefore, we ask your cooperation with the following items in **bold print:**

Family/Candidate Pledge

Family involvement is very important in preparing your child for the reception of the Sacrament. This pledge of commitment to be faithful to your promises made at Baptism, which include attending and participating at Mass on Sunday and Holy Days and to share the Good News with others, should be discussed as a family so as to understand the mutual responsibility each person has before signing this pledge of commitment.

Baptismal Certificate and completed Registration Form

If you have not previously presented your baptismal certificate to St. John's School Office or to the Religious Education Office, please do so as soon as possible. A certificate is not required for those baptized at St. John's Parish.

Sponsor Forms

The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age and must be a Confirmed, practicing Catholic.

The Sponsor should be someone whom the student chooses to help guide and teach him/her as he/she becomes an adult and grows in the Catholic faith. This Sponsor will be a mentor. Parents may not serve as sponsors for their children.

Research Paper – Confirmation Saint

A report on the life of the saint whose name the candidate has chosen for Confirmation is required. Baptismal names may be, and are encouraged to be, used since Confirmation completes what has begun in Baptism. Include the history of the Saint, as well as the reason this Saint was chosen. Please type or print the report.

Interview

Each candidate will have a short, personal interview with Fr. Ray or Mr. Rich Olon. The purpose of this interview is to determine the candidate's religious education preparation and intent regarding the reception of the sacrament. Parents are to attend as well.

Sacramental Catechesis

To be properly prepared for Confirmation, each candidate must have a thorough understanding of the BASIC TEACHINGS OF THE CHURCH included in this folder. In addition to this material, a Bible has been provided for each candidate's preparation.

St. John's Parish Confirmation – Basic Teachings

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF GOD ARE:

- 1. I am the Lord your God; you shall not have other gods before me.
- 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
- 3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's day.
- 4. Honor your father and mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not lie.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

FORM AND MATTER OF THE SACRAMENTS - We hold that a sacrament has two parts: the form, or prayer part of the sacrament; and the matter, the physical and action part of the sacrament.

BAPTISM - The form is: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The matter is pouring water over the head of the person or immersing the person in water three times.

CONFIRMATION – The form is: "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit." The matter is anointing with Holy Chrism on the forehead, which is done by the laying on of hands.

EUCHARIST - The form is "This is My Body; this is My Blood." The matter is wheaten bread and grape wine.

RECONCILIATION/PENANCE – The form is "I absolve you from your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The matter is the confession of sin, contrition, amending one's life and making reparation.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK – The form is the prayer pronounced for the pardon of sins. The matter is the anointing of the forehead and hands with oil of the sick.

HOLY ORDERS - The form is the ordination prayer which invokes the Holy Spirit. The matter is the imposition of the hands of the Bishop.

MATRIMONY — The form entails the exchange of vows by one man and one woman, who are free to marry, in the presence of a priest or deacon (or duly delegated representative) and two witnesses. The matter of the sacrament is the consent expressed by the exchange of vows. In marriage, the couple is the minister of the sacrament; the priest is the official witness of the Church, who also imparts God's blessing.

THE BEATITUDES ARE:

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.

Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you when men revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven. (Matthew 5:3-12)

HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION IN THE UNITED STATES

- 1) Solemnity of Mary (January 1st) On this day, we honor Mary, Mother of God. We are reminded of the role that the Blessed Virgin played in the plan of our salvation. Christ's Birth at Christmas, celebrated just a week before, was made possible by Mary's fiat: "Be it done unto me according to Thy word."
- 2) The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (August 15th) The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a very old feast of the Church, celebrated universally by the sixth century. It commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven before her body could begin to decay—a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time.
- 3) All Saints' Day (November 1st) We honor all the saints in heaven. This is a surprisingly old feast. It arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the martyrdom of saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom. When martyrdoms increased during the persecutions of the late Roman Empire, local dioceses instituted a common feast day in order to ensure that all martyrs, known and unknown, were properly honored. The practice eventually spread to the universal Church.
- 4) The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (December 8th) This feast celebrates, not the conception of Christ (a common misconception), but the conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the womb of Saint Anne; nine months later, on September 8, we celebrate the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Feast of the Immaculate Conception celebrates the saving work of God in preserving the Blessed Virgin Mary from the stain of original sin. Because of His foreknowledge that Mary would consent to bear Christ, God kept Mary free from original sin from the moment of her conception in the womb of her mother, Saint Anne.
- 5) Christmas (December 25th) We celebrate the birth of Jesus.

Corporal Works of Mercy

- 1. Feed the hungry
- 2. Give drink to the thirsty
- 3. Clothe the naked
- 4. Visit the imprisoned
- 5. Shelter the homeless
- 6. Visit the sick
- 7. Bury the dead

Spiritual Works of Mercy

- 1. Admonish the sinner
- 2. Instruct the ignorant
- 3. Counsel the doubtful
- 4. Comfort the sorrowful
- 5. Bear wrongs patiently
- 6. Forgive all injuries
- 7. Pray for the living and the dead

Precepts of the Church

- 1) The Sunday Obligation You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
- 2) Confession You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- 3) The Easter Duty You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
- 4) Fasting and Abstinence You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church. (Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and abstain from meat on the Fridays during Lent. On all other Fridays of the year, we may perform some other penance in place of abstinence.)
- 5) Supporting the Church You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.

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Dear Parents/Guardians,

This will be our 13th year holding our overnight Confirmation retreat at Loyola Retreat House in Faulkner, MD. The response from past attendees has been overwhelmingly positive, and we have consistently witnessed fruitful experiences that do not result from a day retreat. Fr. Ray and I run the retreat, usually with the help of the school and parish catechists and religious sisters and seminarians. Please know that the children are properly chaperoned and have the ability to contact you, or you them, at any time. If you are in any way uncomfortable with the idea of an overnight retreat, we ask that your first step be to schedule a meeting with Fr. Ray to discuss your concerns. If, after that meeting, you are still reluctant to send your child on an overnight retreat, please consider the following alternatives and contact me directly:

- 1. Attend a Confirmation retreat at another parish with prior understanding of pastors/catechetical leaders of both parishes. Students/parents complete all paperwork/retreat expectations of the host parish selected.
- 2. In conversation with pastor/catechetical leader, parents plan for student attendance in the day and early portions of an overnight retreat. This could include pick up before overnight portion of retreat begins, and return to retreat for the next day's activities.
- 3. Parents volunteer as chaperones for the overnight retreat. VIRTUS clearance and fingerprinting with a complete current background check for parent chaperones as required. The Child Protection Coordinator verifies and confirms volunteer compliance in advance of a Confirmation retreat.

This paper must be done in ink, neatly written, or typed (double-spaced) and must cover at least the front and ½ the back of one notebook-size paper. No tear-out papers please. You must cite at least two references including the title and author of the book or the Internet site.

NOTE: Plagiarized papers will be returned and a meeting called with parents and candidate. Do not "copy and paste" your paper. Think about what you are writing and use your own words.

A LETTER TO FR. RAY

REQUESTING THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

You are free to respond to God's call to live your faith more deeply – to worship, witness and serve as a confirmed Catholic Christian. If you wish to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, write a formal letter of request to Fr. Ray, stating your desire to be confirmed. Follow these guidelines:

GREETING

Begin your letter with the greeting: Dear Fr. Ray,

BODY OF THE LETTER

Paragraph 1: Introduce yourself. Say something about your family or your background.

Paragraph 2: Request the sacrament. Give several reasons why you would like to be confirmed.

Paragraph 3: Explain how you have prepared for the sacrament. It is important that you tell about specific parts of your preparation: your prayer life, your celebration of the other sacraments, your service to others exercised at home, in the community and in the parish, etc.

Paragraph 4: Tell how you will continue to carry out your life of service to God and others through the power of the Holy Spirit. Tell how you plan to make your Confirmation in the Faith real and alive in your life.

CONCLUSION

Conclude the letter and write your complete signature.
