Ss. Marcellina and Ambrose

July 17: St. Marcellina (330-400) was St. Ambrose's big sister and discerned a vocation as a vowed virgin. I prayed at her tomb at a side chapel at Sant' Ambrogio, Milan.

And wait, St. Leo IV (855) these were the 'good old days' when the pope organized and routed the Saracens in their pirate raids in the decisive sea battle of Ostia in 849.

But wait! The Martyrs of Compiegne (1794), 16 religious sisters - primarily Carmelites - were guillotined this day in Paris for being "enemies of the people" and "inspiring superstition."

But wait. Bd Peter ToRot (1912 -1945) was a married catechist (his wife was Paula) during the Japanese occupation of Papua New Guinea, who was executed by lethal injection for opposing the re-introduction of polygamy

Saints Alive!

July 20: St. Apollinaris.

Centuries after his death, he appeared in a vision to Saint Romuald and revealed himself as the first bishop of Ravenna and martyr for the faith. His apse mosaic depiction in Chasse is nothing short of breathtaking. In 1969, he was taken off the calendar but good old St. JP II put him back in 2002.

July 21: St. Lawrence of Brindisi (1559-1619). This Franciscan was a brilliant linguist and scripture scholar who quickly rose from obscurity in Verona to notoriety as chaplain General of the Army. He led the troops into battle against the Turks and saved Hungary in 1601. He sometimes took three hours to say Mass and handkerchiefs used to wipe away his copious tears during Mass quickly became relics. He wrote beautifully about our Lady as

dispenser of every grace. He was buried in Northern Spain at Villafranca del Bierzo.

July 22: St. Mary Magdalene

(first century). Luke 8:3 says it all – she who is the first saint exorcized from demons would become the first to share the Good News of the risen Lord on Easter morn. Because of my love for Provence, France, I like to think that her skull and jaw bone are indeed in the gold reliquary at St. Maximin-la-Sainte-Baume.

July 23: St. Bridget of Sweden

(1303-1373) was a happily married mother of 8 until her husband Ulf Gudmarsson died on the way to Compostela on pilgrimage. Her mystic visions and revelations haunt the world today. She is the patron of calamitous pilgrimages; she was shipwrecked on the way to a pilgrimage to the holy land. She died on the corner of the Palazzo Farnese next to the French Embassy and I pray at this site when in Rome.



THE TEN COMMANDMENTS A reflection by Michael Hains Accessed on EWTN website

1. I AM THE LORD THY GOD: THOU SHALT NOT HAVE STRANGE GODS BEFORE ME. COMMANDS: faith, hope, love, and

worship of God; reverence for holy things; prayer.

FORBIDS: idolatry; superstition; spiritism; tempting God; sacrilege; attendance at false worship.

2. THOU SHALT NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD THY GOD IN VAIN.

COMMANDS: reverence in speaking about God and holy things; the keeping of oaths and vows.

FORBIDS: blasphemy; the irreverent use of God's name; speaking disrespectfully of holy things; false oaths and the breaking of vows.

3. KEEP THE SABBATH HOLY.

COMMANDS: going to church on Sundays and holy days of obligation. FORBIDS: missing church through one's own fault; unnecessary servile work on Sunday and holy days of obligation.

4. HONOUR THY FATHER AND THY MOTHER.

COMMANDS: love; respect; obedience articles; giving unjust measure or on the part of children; care on the part of parents for the spiritual and temporal welfare of their children; obedience to civil and religious superiors. FORBIDS: hatred of parents and

5. THOU SHALT NOT KILL.

superiors; disrespect; disobedience.

COMMANDS: safeguarding of one's own life and bodily welfare and that of

FORBIDS: unjust killing; suicide; abortion; sterilization; dueling; endangering life and limb of self or others.

6. THOU SHALT NOT COMMIT ADULTERY.

COMMANDS: chastity in word and deed.

FORBIDS: obscene speech; impure actions alone or with others.

7. THOU SHALT NOT STEAL.

COMMANDS: respect for the property of rights and others; the paying of just debts; paying just wages to employees; integrity in public office.

FORBIDS: theft; damage to the

property of others; not paying just debts; not returning found or borrowed weight in selling; not paying just wages; bribery; graft; cheating; fraud; accepting stolen property; not giving an honest day's work for wages received; breach of contract.

8. THOU SHALT NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST THY NEIGHBOR.

COMMANDS: truthfulness; respect for the good name of others; the observance of secrecy when required. FORBIDS: lying; injury to the good name of others; slander; tale-bearing; rash judgment; contemptuous speech and the violation of secrecy.

9. THOU SHALT NOT COVET THY NEIGHBOR'S WIFE.

COMMANDS: purity in thought. FORBIDS: willful impure thought and

10. THOU SHALT NOT COVET THY NEIGHBOR'S GOODS.

COMMANDS: respect for the rights of others.

FORBIDS: the desire to take, to keep, or damage the property of others.


