Bd. Frédéric Ozanam (1813-1853). He was beatified when I was at World Youth Day in Paris in 1997; I was struck by this professor's love for his wife and daughter, the poor, Western literature, linguistics, politics and his open-door policy for his students. Oh, and in his spare time, he founded the St. Vincent de Paul Society! Check out his relic shrine at St. Joseph des Carmes, Paris.

September 9: St. Peter Claver (1580-1654) was inspired by the humble doorkeeper Jesuit, St. Alphonsus Rodriguez, to accept the mission to Columbia. In Cartagena, Peter was ordained and the rest is

history. He was called the

"slave to the Africans" as he sought to bring about social justice, faith and solace to the slaves of the New World. He baptized 300,000 in 40 years of work.

Bd. Jacques Laval (1803-1864) set sail for Mauritius and in the course of his career, made 60,000 African converts.

September 10: St. Aubert d'Avranches (725) was a French bishop who had three visions of St. Michael the Archangel who told him to construct the church of Mt. St. Michel.

St Nicholas of Tolentino

(1245-1305) was an Augustinian priest and miracle worker who had a contemporary biographer – which mean documents abound and not pious myths.

*Individual spiritual guidance is offered by our Priests and Deacons.




