Scotland. She was happily married 25 years with 8 children. Her relics were safely carried to El Escorial, near Madrid.

Nov. 17: St. Elizabeth of Hungary (1207-1231)
Widowed at the age of 20, she was tireless in caring for the sick, poor and elderly in the hospice, she built next to her house in Marburg. A 3rd order Franciscan, she wore the habit till death. She was canonized just 4 years after her death and the Elisabethkirche in Marburg became a place of great pilgrimage. (My 'Schmidt' ancestors lived right up the road in Bracht.)
