

I was given her relics (with documentary papers) while on pilgrimage. We will venerate her relics this Friday at Mass.

July 8: SS. Kilian and Companions (689) came from Mullagh – near the Cavan/Meath border (where the Reilly side of my family hails) and would evangelize and become martyrs in Würzburg. Their three heads were enshrined in the cathedral. Like John the Baptist – Kilian was killed for telling the local neophyte chief that his marriage was against God's law.

July 9: St. Veronica Guiliani

(1660-1727). A long time before she died, this Franciscan 'mystic of the passion' drew a picture of her heart that showed where the Lord had imprinted the instruments of the passion. A post-mortem showed objects in the right ventricle that corresponded exactly. Her case is the most remarkable of mystical phenomena.

July 10: Bd Emmanuel Ruiz and Companions (1860). The Druse (an ancient Syrian Muslim sect) took exception to the presence of Christianity. Step 1) all Christians were forbidden to bear arms; 2) 14 thousand Christians were murdered. Among them, this Spanish Franciscan in Damascus.
