

### Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus's passion and death on the cross. There are 14 stations that each depict a moment on his journey to Calvary, usually through sacred art, prayers, and reflections. The practice began as pious pilgrims traced his path through Jerusalem on the Via Dolorosa.

Later, for the many who wanted to pass along the same route, but could not make the trip to Jerusalem, a practice developed that eventually took the form of the fourteen stations currently found in almost every church throughout the world. Similarly, the 150 Hail Marys that were recited for the rosary were an adaptation of the medieval monastic practice of reciting the 150 psalms in the Psalter.

#### St. Patrick's Day 2023 – Dispensation from Abstaining from Meat

Because St. Patrick's Day falls on a Friday this year and it is an important feast day for many American Catholics, Cardinal Gregory, by his authority as the Archbishop of Washington, has granted an exception (technically called a "dispensation") to the ordinary requirement to abstain from meat on Fridays of Lent. All Catholics of the Archdiocese of Washington (including us here at St. John's) are free to eat meat that day. Those who do so are encouraged to abstain from meat some other day as part of their Lenten penitential practices.
