

St. Agnes

Jan 18: St. Margaret of Hungary (1242-1270). The daughter of King Bela IV who defended Christendom from the Tartar invasions. She was offered to the Benedictine nuns at the age of 3 and became a living "self-crucifixion" of penance and reparation as a nun. She died at the age of 28.

Jan 19: St. Henry of Uppsala (1156). Bishop and martyr of English descent who was sent as a missionary to Finland when the Swedes defeated the Finns in battle and forced their conversion. Henry stayed behind to evangelize and was killed by a blow from an axe. Henry is the patron of Finland.

Jan 20: St. Fabian (250) and St. Sebastian (300).

Saints Alive for refusing to reject Christ and the vocation to purity

Pope St. Fabian's tomb was only rediscovered in 1915 with the words in Greek: "Fabian - bishop - martyr." He died in the persecution of Decius. Sebastian, patron of athletes, died under Diocletian's persecution of the Christians in the army. Shout out to Sebastian DeStefano!

Jan 21: St. Agnes (292-305). <u>I have visited her relic – a tiny</u> thirteen year old skull bone at the place of her martyrdom – since 1996. Go the church of Sant'Agnese in Agonia. It's just outside the former Stadium of Domitian in Rome. I count her as a dear friend who moves my heart to tenderness. when I think of her thrown into a brothel and martyred

the vocation to purity.

Jan 24: St. François de Sales (1567-1622). Oh my! The spiritual giant from Annecy (just southwest of Geneva) oversees conversions on a massive scale in the Chablais and Thonon. An entire Calvinist region of 60,000 was won back to Catholicism through this one man. He would credit the mystic Mme. Barbe Acarie or St. Jeanne de Chantal for his success. He loved pilgrimages and prayed at the tomb of St. Charles Borromeo in Milan: his sweat and tears are on the shroud of Turin. His last words? "Humilité" written 3 times on a scrap of


