**St. John Chrysostom**

**September 12: St. Guy of Anderlecht** (1012) was a sacristan, and a wanderer: We honor all the Guys of St. Mary's County who carry his name.

**September 13: St. John Chrysostom** (350-407) is the golden-tongued bishop of Constantinople who called the Empress Eudoxia a "Jezebel." He was promptly banished. His preaching is the definition of zeal.

**September 14: St. Albert of Jerusalem** (1150-1214) was the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem who approved of the Carmelite Order, and was stabbed to death as he took part in the feast of the Holy Cross in the streets of Akko.

## Saints Alive!

**September 16: St. Cornelius and Cyprian** (253-258) Cornelius is the compassionate Roman Pope, Cyprian is the hard-liner Bishop of Carthage: together they were the martyred face of the Church leadership during the vicious Decian persecution. We read Cyprian's powerful letters to this day.

**September 17: St. Robert Bellarmine** (1542-1621) was one of the best minds and engaging personalities of the Catholic Reformation. While we fault his handling of the Galileo affair, Robert was a Jesuit spiritual director for the likes of St. Aloysius Gonzaga and an apologist extraordinaire.

**September 18: St. Joseph of Cupertino** (1603-1663) is the Capuchin priest known for his lack of mental acumen and his ecstatic levitations that were so frequent and so well documented from the age of 27. He died in Osimo, hidden away from the curious crowds. We love praying at his tomb.

Class will meet in the St. Jude Room between the end of the 9am mass and the beginning of the 1130am mass... so 10am-11:15am.

The RCIA program explains the major dogmas of the faith including: the importance of faith and authority, the divinity of Christ, the Trinity, making a good confession, the real presence of the Eucharist, proper understanding of the 10 Commandments.

### BAPTISMS

The Rite of Baptism is celebrated by appointment. Parents are required to meet with the pastor and attend an obligatory preparation session preferably before the birth of your child. Call the rectory to schedule your appointment.

### MARRIAGES

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the ceremony.

### SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

Please notify the rectory when a parishioner would like to receive the sacraments and is homebound, in a nursing home, or in the hospital.

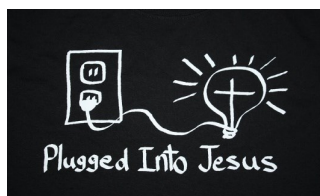

## Status of St. John's/SCN Mission Activities

### Mission #15:

The "St. John's Mary Mileto House" has been postponed multiple times due to the COVID-19 pandemic and is currently scheduled for 6-12 March 2022. Due to the postponements and the rising cost of materials, an additional \$1,300 was sent for the increased costs.

### Mission #16:



Amazingly, St. John's is venturing on the groundwork plans for their 16<sup>th</sup> mission! So much has been accomplished by St. John's in the last 7 years in so many mission areas throughout the world, and in our own country – Belize City, Belize; Botswana, Africa; Las Flores, Belize; Crow Reservation, Pryor, Montana; Dunbar, Pennsylvania; and Durant, Mississippi. Efforts included building houses, repairing homes, working in desolate school mission areas, painting schools, laying block, pouring concrete, and assisting with disaster relief. You have helped change many people's lives. A request for volunteers will be sought at a later date via the bulletin. It has not been determined whether the next mission will be inside or outside the Continental United States.

Our annual mission collection will be held the weekend of 25-26 September 2021. The current cost to build a 16' x 20' two-room house in Belize has increased to \$8,200, which includes plumbing, aluminum shutters, and electric. Whatever the mission, our focus is on meeting people, learning about other cultures, making friends and sharing faith, while we work side-by-side with people in need. We know it has been a difficult year, but any help you can give would be so appreciated. Make your check payable to St. John's Church and in the memo line write: "Belize Missions".
