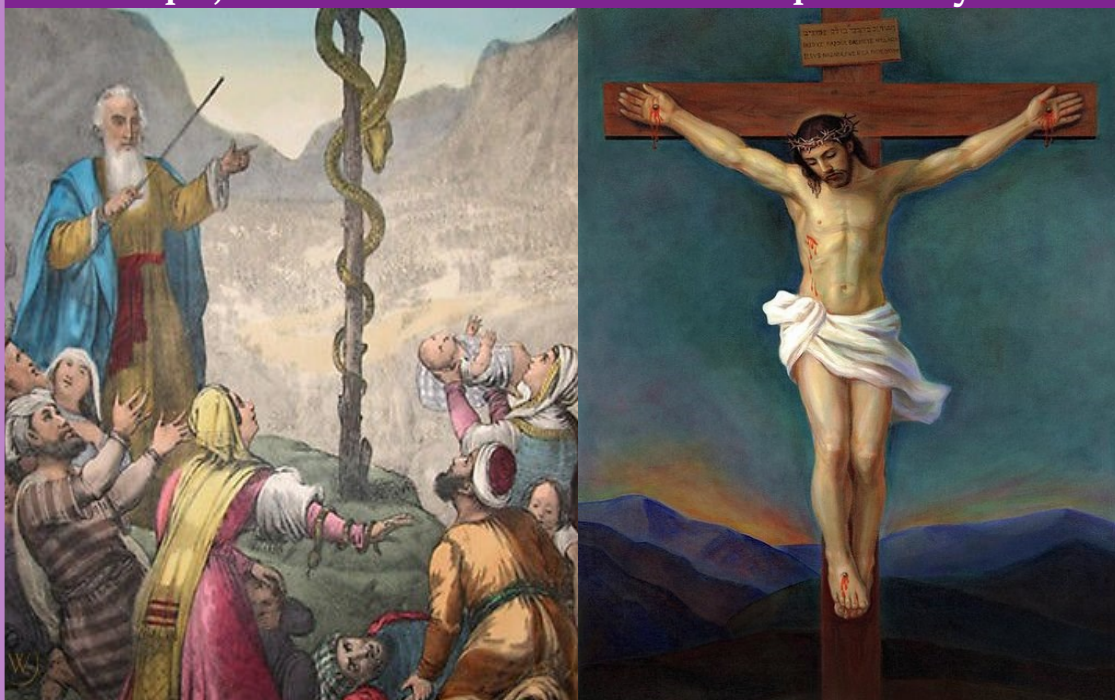

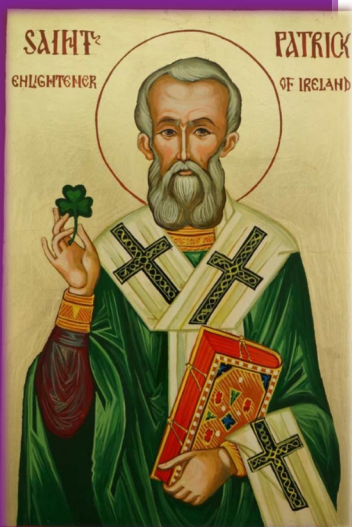
MISSION STATEMENT

St. Patrick

Ecclesiastes 3:1-2, 8

For everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted. A time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.



Mar 14: St. Matilda (895-968). Queen of beauty, learning, devotion with patience and self-abnegation. (One of her five children was called Heinrich the Quarrelsome). Her relic shrine is in Quedlinburg.

Mar 15 : St Louise de Marillac (1590-1660) with St. Vincent de Paul, Louise launched one of the most impressive movements to alleviate and remedy the sufferings of the poor in the history of the Church. She rejected the term “mother superior” and chose the term “sister servant”. Go to the Rue du Bac in Paris and pray next to her incorrupt body! And yet **St. Clement Hofbauer** (1751-1820) shines as the second founder of the Redemptorists-who introduced the order “north of the Alps”. His last name was Dvorak-he

was ethically a Slav- who preached from Lithuania to Vienna. He is the patron saint of Vienna and his body lies in the Redemptorist Church there.

Mar 17: St. Patrick (5th century). Read his Letter to the Soldiers of Corticus and his Confession and touch the authentic spirit of Patrick, undisputed author of both works. His excommunication of slave-owners is especially telling – he knew what slavery did to the human soul from his own experience. He was astonished by the young who spontaneously chose to be monks or virgins despite parental opposition.

Mar 18: St. Cyril of Jerusalem (315-386). His writings are the reason we have communion in the hand restored as an option for the faithful today...he made sure that the Easter Vigil

liturgy was “spinetingling” (to use his own expression) and filled with scripture.

Mar 19: St. Joseph (1st Century) has been shining popular devotion since the 15th century- before that- he was a man cloaked in silence. He is now especially evoked as the patron for all married men-that they might be spiritual guides to their unique families. And **Bd. Marcel Callo** (1921-1945) was a Frenchman from Brittany who was arrested by the Gestapo for being “too much of a Catholic.” Two years of concentration camps destroyed his health, but never his fervent spirit. He died in Güsen I.

Mar 20: St. Ippolito Galantini (1565-1619), even as a child he could memorize and repeat whole sermons. He was a lay catechist and taught CCD to the poor in Florence.

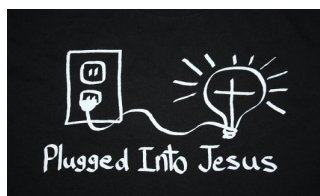
