April 1: St. Hugh of Grenoble



April 2: St. Francis Paola (1416

-1507) was a southern Italian who founded the Friars Minims (meaning the least brothers) and was the greatest wonder-worker of the age (he even walked on water). He credited his selfconquest to fasting. The pope ordered this humble Franciscan to visit the French king, and he died on a Good Friday in Plessisles-Tours.
