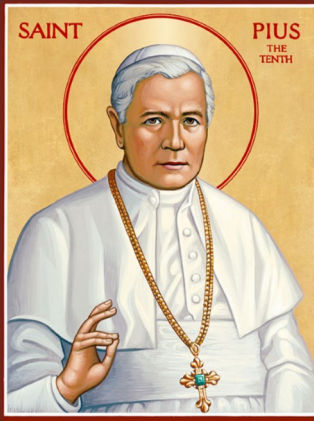

Ecclesiastes 3:1-2, 8

For everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted. A time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.

**August 15: St. Stanislaus**

Kostka (1550-1568) was, even before the age of 18, profoundly influenced by St. Peter Canisius and St. Francis Borgia. Just like St. John Berchmans, this Polish Jesuit scholar collapsed under the intensity of the Roman summer. He is the model of angelic purity.

August 16: St. Rock (1378) is beloved as San Rocco in Italian and St. Roch in French – he is the mysterious pilgrim who brings healing to the sick. And don't forget

St. Beatrice da Silva (1424-1490) who founded an religious order simply to glorify the mystery of the Immaculate Conception. When we are on pilgrimage at Tepeyac, Mexico, we stay with their convent.

August 17: St. Clare of Montefalco (1308) was given three divine favors; her remains stayed incorrupt, an image of the cross and instruments of the

passion appeared on her fibrous heart tissue, and her blood liquefies!

August 18: St. Helen (329) is the only known patron saint of divorced women, this empress became an enthusiastic Christian in 312; by 326 she had traveled to the Holy Land in search for the true cross and other relics.

August 19th: St. Jean Eudes (1601-1680) "Preachers beat the bushes, but confessors catch the birds!" is his great expression to describe the work of adult retreats that gave theological depth to the twin feasts of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. **St. Louis d' Anjou** (1274-1297) Franciscan bishop of Toulouse by the age of 23 and died that same year; he was known for his purity and humility. He was canonized in Avi-

gnon while his mom was still alive.

August 20th: St. Bernard de Clairvaux (1090-1153) Abbot and Doctor of the Church who is called the "last of the church fathers" with such a winning personality, that 31 nobles entered the monastery with him. His letters make him the master of metaphor; he had no problem exposing the wickedness and stupidity of the rich and powerful cardinals.

August 21st: St. Pius X (1835-1914) his father was a mailman, his mother a seamstress from just north of Venice. He called liberal Catholics "wolves in sheep's clothing" and as pope he clearly expressed that for, "a sick society, people needed to obey and not quibble." Anti-Modernist oaths were to be taken by all who would teach theology. His relics are everywhere!

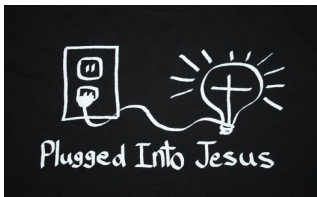

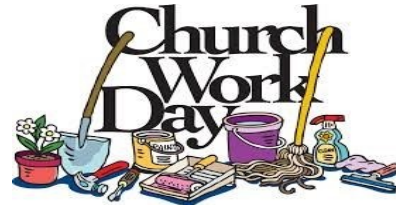


School & Church
