were seized in the cemetery of Praetextus and butchered where Mass was being said. Pray at St. Callistus catacombs where they were buried in Rome!

August 8: St. Dominic **Guzmán** (1170-1221) is a vague figure who left no writings. However, he changed the face of Christianity by founding the Dominican Order. Even though he hailed from Spain, the bulk of his evangelizing work was around Toulouse, France. You can feel his presence in Bologna at his relic's shrine. Fave teaching, "Arm yourselves with prayer, not a sword! Wear humility, not fine clothes!"

August 9: St. Edith Stein (1891-1942) was, by the age

of 15, a Jewish atheist, convinced that she would never pray again. By 1922, she was a baptized Catholic and ready for Discalced Carm. As she went to her death in the gas chambers of Auschwitz, she was fully aware that God had called her to be a new Queen Esther in expiation for her people.

August 10: St. Laurence

(258). After the massacre of his Pope Sixtus, this remaining deacon assembled the decrepit, blind, lame, crippled, lepers, orphans and widows before the Roman prefect and said, "here is the real treasure of the church." He was grilled to death for his cheek. Visit his ancient relic's shrine at San Lorenzo-fuori-le-mura when in Rome!

August 11: St. Clare of
Assisi (1193-1253. When I pray at her tomb (four times now) I just start crying. A purity and ferocious sense of dignity overwhelms me. She is very present. We will venerate her relic this day.

**August 13: SS Pontian and** Hippolytus (236+) are the patron saints of reconciliation under duress – Pope and antipope alike were deported to Sardinia and were martyred by ill-treatment. We visit their graves at St. Callistus Cemetery in Rome. and don't forget St. John Berchmans (1599-1621) for he is the patron saint of altar servers, cobblers, duck hunters, actors, 'dogwhisperers' and final exams. The strain of the hot Roman summer and studies proved to be too much for this Dutch

### St. John's Household Green Team

Just because you are on vacation doesn't mean your house is. Your house can still be using a lot of unnecessary energy while you are on vacation. Here are some tips to save energy while on vacation:

- Turn your thermostat up. Consider a Smart Thermostat that you can adjust from your phone so on your way
  home you can start cooling your house down before you arrive back. SMECO offers rebates for Smart
  Thermostats <a href="https://www.smeco.coop/save-energy-and-money/smart-thermostats">https://www.smeco.coop/save-energy-and-money/smart-thermostats</a>
- Consider turning your hot water tank off at the breaker. Just leave yourself a reminder note to turn it back on 1<sup>st</sup> thing so it can be heating while you are unpacking.
- Unplug small electrical equipment such as radios, DVD players or TVs when not in use. TVs and cable/satellite converter boxes can draw or "leak" as much as 40 watts an hour even when switched off. Electronic appliances can act like energy vampires, sucking power even when they are not in use. Your coffee maker, cable box, game console, laptop computer and even rechargeable toothbrushes are a few examples.
- Keep window blinds and curtains closed to block sunlight and keep your home cooler during the hot summer days.
- Make sure fans and lights are turned off. For security lights, consider using a timer. And, switch bulbs to LEDs to save even more.
- Many of us empty our refrigerators before heading out of town, but did you know a fully stocked refrigerator
  keeps cold better than an empty one? Conserve even more energy by adjusting the thermostats on your
  refrigerator and freezer to higher settings; 38°F for the refrigerator and 5°F for the freezer. For trips lasting four
  weeks or more, consider emptying your refrigerator completely and unplugging it.
