September 18: St. Joseph of Cupertino (1603-1663) is the Capuchin priest known for his lack of mental acumen and his ecstatic levitations that were so frequent and so well documented from the age of 27. He died in Osimo, hidden away from the curious crowds. We love praying at his tomb.

September 19: St. Januarius (305) *!San Gennaro!* He is the beloved martyred Bishop of Naples, most famous for the liquefying of his blood. We'll see today if his blood boils what with the current state of the Church!

September 20: St. Andrew Kim (1820-1846) is the first native-born Korean priest, ordained in August in Shanghai, arrested in June

the following year, and beheaded on this day at Saenam't'o, Korea. He had an impressive personality, intellect, and fluency with languages. 103 martyrs are specially commemorated on this day as well.

September 21: St. Matthew (1st Century) is the evangelist who died of natural causes, and whose relics were taken from Ethiopia to Brittany to Salerno. We love the name changes: he is also called Levi and "son of Alphaeus" (But hey, tax collectors need to change their names sometimes.)

September 22: St. Felix IV, Pope (530) was crushed between Goths and Byzantines in political intrigue, but found time to

craft the glorious teachings about grace at the council of Orange and transform Vespasian's library in the Roman forum into the church of SS. Cosmas and Damian.

September 23: St. Pio of Pietrelcina (1887-1968). The people love a wonder-worker – someone who can bi-locate, receive the transverberation of the heart and the stigmata, read minds, and provide miraculous cures. But did he suffer! Intense suffering accompanies such preternatural gifts.

September 24: St. Pacifico of San Severino (1653-1721) was a Franciscan priest who, by the age of 35, was becoming deaf, blind and crippled, and yet rewarded with supernatural senses of clairvoyance to compensate.
