St. Anthony of Padua Pray for us!

June 9: Bd. Anna Maria Taigi (1769-1837) was a poor servant girl from Siena who as a married woman with seven children in Rome had a spiritual life of the highest order. Her poverty, responsibilities, spiritual direction with even a cardinal caused quite a stir at the Chigi Palace where she worked. Her body is laid out for veneration at the Church of San Crisogono in Trastevere.

June 11: St. Barnabas (first century) was of a Jewish priestly family from the island of Cyprus who is styled as an apostle because of his travels with St. Paul. At Lystra he was mistaken for the Greek God, Jupiter! He is known to be 'constantly working' yet full of 'joy in the Holy Spirit.'

June 12: St. Onuphrius (400) was an Egyptian desert hermit who wore nothing but a loin-cloth of leaves and a beard that reached to the ground. His story

underscores the teaching of the communion of the saints. A church in his honor is right next door to the NAC and the Bambino Gesù.

June 13: St. Anthony of Padua (1195-1231) was already an Augustinian friar by the age of 15 moving from Lisbon to Coimbra, to Morocco, to Sicily to Assisi to become one of the most popular Franciscan saints of all times. See his tongue and vocal cords in Padua! They never decayed!

June 14: St. Methodius of Constantinople (847) was born in Sicily and moved to Constantinople to get a good government job. He became a monk, and eventually patriarch; he finally crushed the iconoclast heresy that raged in the East for so long because of the influence of Islam.

June 15: St. Germaine de Pibrac (1579-1601) was a poor and sickly farm-girl who lived a life of suffering and astonishing miracles in this little town outside of Toulouse. An annual procession to her relic shrine in Pibrac

still occurs to this day.

June 16: St. Jean- François Régis (1597-1640). The man! (He was ordained on this day in 1630.) Regis' labors reaped a harvest of conversions. However, his boldness led to a conflict with other Jesuits, a period of tension with the local bishop, and threats of violence from those whose vices he condemned. He longed to be a martyr in the New World.

June 17: St. Rainerius of Pisa (1117-1161) is the principal patron saint of Pisa! Forget the leaning tower – study the frescoes depicting his life at the Campo Santo, and then venerate his relics in the cathedral. He went from penitential merchant to pilgrim mendicant from Pisa to Mt. Tabor.
