St. Isabelle of **Portugal Pray for us!**

July 1: St. Oliver Plunkett (1625 -1681). County Meath native and elevated to the position of the Archbishop of Armagh and was falsely accused of treason. See his head on display in Drogheda and St. Junípero Serra (1713-1784) Spanish Franciscan who founded 22 missions from Baja to Central coastal California. Pray at his relic's shrine in Carmel-by-the-Sea.

July 2: St. Otto of Bamberg

(1062-1139) is the bishop hailed as the 'apostle of Pomerania'. He evangelized this part of Poland with great effectiveness. And Bd. Peter of Luxembourg (1369-1387) is patron of Avignon – though he spent only the last year of his life advising the pope at the court. My 'home' parish – St. Didier – is the place where his relic's shrine is located.

July 3: St Thomas the Apostle "the twin" or "the doubting

Saints Alive!

in Mylapore, near Madras in India in the year 72. I know him best as the "Apostle to India. " And St. Raymund de Toulouse (1050-1118) is a widower who sought ordination late in life – and made the Basilica of St. Sernin such a famous shrine on the road to Compostela for the rest of the Middle Ages.

July 4: Bd. Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901

-1925) was deeply spiritual, ardently political, easygoing, extroverted, warm, a keen mountaineer and sportsman and noted for his charity to the poor in Torino. So popular – his relics have been moved next to the Shroud of Turin in the Cathedral.

July 5: St. Isabelle of Portugal (1271-1336) was married at the age of 12 to an adulterous king and simply exuded goodness, no matter what came her way. As a widow, she became a Poor Clare (Franciscan) in Coïmbra. We prayed at her tomb on the way to Fatima.

July 6: St. Maria Goretti (1890-1902). Thomas" was purportedly buried We've been to her relic's shrine and I

said Mass over her tomb. She is so beloved and seems so alive to me, that I keep forgetting that she was martyred for purity 116 years ago. It is her visits to people beyond the grave that stir the heart. She calls on people to forgive their persecutors. I was given her relics (with documentary papers) while on pilgrimage.

July 8: SS. Kilian and

Companions (689) came from Mullagh – near the Cavan/Meath border (where the Reilly side of my family hails) and would evangelize and become martyrs in Würzburg. Their three heads were enshrined in the cathedral. Like John the Baptist – Kilian was killed for telling the local neophyte chief that his marriage was against God's law.





Catholic Evangelization Strategy 2 – Ask Questions and Listen


