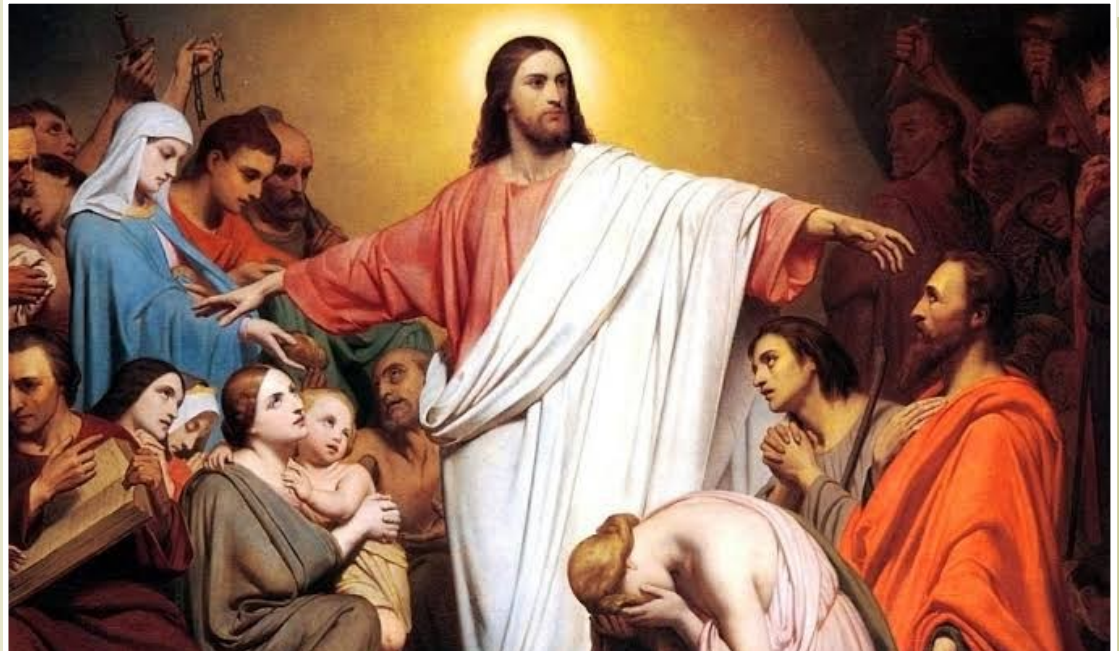

**St. Bonaventure
Pray for us!**

July 9: St. Veronica Guiliari (1660-1727). A long time before she died, this Franciscan ‘mystic of the passion’ drew a picture of her heart that showed where the Lord had imprinted the instruments of the passion. A post-mortem showed objects in the right ventricle that corresponded exactly. Her case is the most remarkable of mystical phenomena.

July 10: Bd Emmanuel Ruiz and companions (1860). The Druse (an ancient Syrian Muslim sect) took exception to the presence of Christianity. Step 1) all Christians were forbidden to bear arms; 2) 14 thousand Christians were murdered. Among them, this Spanish Franciscan in Damascus.

July 11: St. Benedict of Nursia (480-550) this Patriarch of Western monasticism and patron of all Europe left the decadence of Rome for the caves of Subiaco then the heights of Monte Cassino. All Benedictines

honor his memory with that of his twin sister, Scholastica. I’ve prayed in Subiaco once and in Monte Cassino three times.

July 12: St. Giovanni Gualbert (990-1073). I know him through the wonderful Early Renaissance Florentine artwork celebrating his miracles.

July 13: Bd. Clelia Barbieri (1847-1870) is one of the most attractive women saints. Though she died at the age of 23 from TB outside of Bologna, she had a continuous awareness of the presence of God and a constant intimate conversation with him. Her photograph says it all. I love this gal.

July 14: St. Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680) known as Lily of the Mohawks was an Algonquin–Mohawk laywoman from Auriesville, NY who abandoned her pagan family to follow Christ under the direction of the French Jesuits outside of Montreal.

July 15: St. Bonaventure (1221-1274) is the “second founder of the Franciscans” who kept a balanced approach to issues but decidedly moved the order to become more probook, pro-university, pro-learnings; imagine St.

Francis as a University professor/ philosopher and you get the picture.

July 17: St. Marcellina (330-400) was St. Ambrose’s big sister and discerned a vocation as a vowed virgin. I prayed at her tomb at a side chapel at Sant’ Ambrogio, Milan.

And wait, **St. Leo IV** (855) these were the ‘good old days’ when the pope organized and routed the Saracens in their pirate raids in the decisive sea battle of Ostia in 849.

But wait! **The Martyrs of Compiègne** (1794), 16 religious sisters - primarily Carmelites - were guillotined tis day in Paris for being “enemies of the people” and “inspiring superstition.”

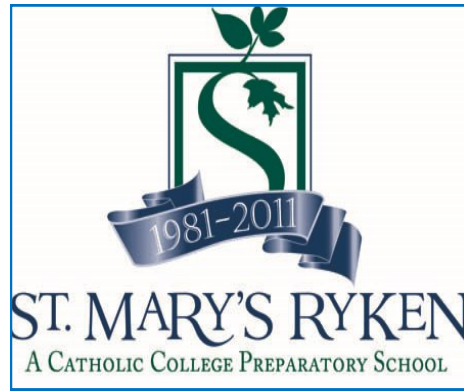
