

Apr 29: St. St. Catherine of Siena (1347-1380) is the 24th of 25 children born to Giacomo di Benincasa and Lapa di Puccio di Piacenti. (Many say her mother should be canonized as well for giving birth to so many!) By the age of 21, her spiritual life was so intense that she experienced a mystical espousal with Jesus as bridegroom. She cared for victims of the plague, preached, performed exorcisms and was a tour de force in challenging the popes in Avignon. Now a Doctor of the Church, pray at her mummified head on display in Siena, or before her body under the main altar at the *Sopre Minerva* Church in Rome.

Apr 30: St. Pius V (1504-1572) is the Dominican Pope with one thing on his mind – the salvation of souls. Contemporaries complained that he tried to change Rome into a monastery. In 1566, he took up the mantle of reform called the Council of Trent. Visit his relics shrine at Santa Maria Maggiore in Rome; see the chapel where he prayed during the battle of Lepanto.

May 1: St. Peregrine Laziosi (1265-1345). AKA San Pellegrino. He was the most famous of all Servite priests known for having been miraculous healed of abusive anger to varicose veins. He is the go -to patron saint for cancer patients. He died and his buried in Forli.

May 2: St. Athanasius (295-373) of Alexandria Egypt was a brilliant theologian who clarified that Jesus was truly God and truly man (The Incarnation). I like to imagine him as the 30 year old priest secretary walking the beautiful shores of *Iznik Gölü* Turkey (Nicea) while discussing theology at the council in 325 with the saints of Cappadocia.

May 3: St. Philip and James the Less (first century) are venerated together ever since their

relics were brought to Rome together and placed at the *Dodici Apostoli* Church in Rome. Philip seems to be the one most fluent in Greek; James, son of Alpheus, was a blood cousin of Jesus and ruled the church in Jerusalem till his martyrdom in the year 61.

May 4: St. Florian (304+). Patron saint of Firefighters was scourged, flayed and cast into the river Emms where it flows into the Danube in Austria.

Called to Community Service? St. John's Charitable Society may be the answer!

The St. John's Charitable Society (SJCS) is a group of parish volunteers whose goal is to assist residents of St. Mary's County who are struggling to make ends meet. The primary work of SJCS is carried out through a **phone ministry** whereby our volunteers accept calls from those in need, and determine if, and how, SJCS can help. Working in teams of two, our volunteers commit to taking calls over a two week period. Phone assignments occur approximately 3-4 times per year, and are planned around each volunteer's schedule requirements.

All calls are handled on a dedicated SJCS cell phone. And, except for a meeting of SJCS members every other Thursday evening, the phone ministry is carried out within the volunteer's home environment. Training and shadowing is provided for new volunteers.

In addition to the phone ministry, SJCS volunteers may also participate in:

Organizing the Christmas Angel Tree Program, to help make Christmas happier for a child or elderly person in need.

Organizing the St. John's Wrapping Arms 'Round Many (WARM) team, which participates as a "helping church" in the local interfaith effort to provide meals and overnight shelter for overflow homeless of St. Mary's County during the winter.

Through participation in SJCS, our volunteers: Improve lives. Provide second chances. Meet others who desire to put Christian values into action by serving the local community.
