St. John Capistrano

Oct 23: St. John of Capistrano

(1386-1456). This married mayor of Perugia, while imprisoned during civil war, was overwhelmed by a vision of St. Francis. John got out of jail, dismissed his wife and became a ferocious Franciscan - thanks to the inspiration of Saints Colette and Bernardino. He became the inquisitor for Bohemia and Hungary. He was ahead of his time in his dealings with witches. He led the forces into battle in Belgrade, and successfully turned back the Turks. Hold up! Wait a minute! St. Severinus Boethius (480-524). Brilliant married Christian philosopher who was arrested, tortured and martyred in Pavia where his bones can be seen, directly under the relics of St. Augustine at San Pietro. Always pray for our new priest Fr. Kyle Vance on this day; he is devoted to this saint.

Oct 24: St. Antonio Maria Claret (1807-1870). Spanish founder of the Claretian Order

was greatly concerned with evangelization through the written word. Two hundred books and pamphlets are credited to his direct work alone. He later became Archbishop in Santiago, Cuba. He had a high degree of ecstasies, prophecy and healings. His tomb is near Barcelona. But wait! What about...

Blessed Luigi Guanella (1842-1915) leaves his native Como and heads to Turin to meet St. John Bosco. He founded a religious order himself with the twin role of healing and lifting up the sick and the poor. He was all about Catholic Social Justice and was nick named the "Garibaldi of Charity" by Pope Pius XI.

Oct 25: SS. Crispin &

<u>Crispinian</u> (285+) Shakespeare? Henry V? The Battle of Agincourt? Ring a bell? <u>Bd. Thaddeus MacCarthy</u> (1455-1497) From Persecuted bishop in Cork to humble pilgrim at the foot of the Alps, ya gotta love this guy.

Oct 26: St. Rusticus de Narbonne (461+) was a

discouraged Bishop who asked the Pope for permission to just call it quits; Pope Leo the Great wrote him a great letter to lift his spirits that is appropriate even today!

Oct 27: Bd. Contardo Ferrini (1859-1902). Brilliant scholar from theology to linguistics to geology, he studied from Pavia to Berlin. He is a modern patron saint for students, all under the truth of our creator God. He died at the tender age of 43.

October 28: SS. Simon & Jude (first century). Flagging in Zeal? Go to Simon. Desperate or Hopeless? Go to Jude. Never known to fail.

October 29: St. Narcissus of Jerusalem (215+). Patron saint of the really, really old. He was a bishop who lived past 116, his coadjutor Bishop Alexander who writes in the year 212 that Narcissus is still hanging on!






